


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# **Motorola Droid Turbo 2 Battery Replacement**

Use this guide to replace a dead or dying...

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#### **INTRODUCTION**

Use this guide to replace a dead or dying battery for your Motorola Droid Turbo 2.

### TOOLS:

Tweezers (1)

Spudger (1)

SIM Card Eject Tool (1)

iFixit Opening Tool (1)

iFixit Opening Picks (Set of 6) (1)

T4 Torx Screwdriver (1)

## PARTS:

Droid Turbo 2 Battery - Genuine (1)
Droid Turbo 2 Rear Cover Adhesive (1)

#### Step 1 — Battery



- Using your fingers, carefully remove the black tape from the battery.
- (i) Try not to rip the tape as you will use it on the new battery.

### Step 2






- Remove two 4.0 mm T4 Torx screws securing the metal battery bracket.
- Remove the metal bracket.

# Step 3




 Use the angled tweezers to disconnect the small connector near the bottom right corner of the battery.

#### Step 4



 Using a plastic opening tool, unlatch the small black ribbon on the upper right corner of the battery.

#### Step 5



- Reheat the iOpener and apply it to the battery to help soften the adhesive holding it to the display assembly.
- Use an old credit card, opening pick, or other flat plastic pry tool to carefully pry out the battery from the adhesive holding it in place.
- ⚠ Don't deform or puncture the battery, or it may leak dangerous chemicals or catch fire.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
