


SteelSeries Arctis Pro Plus GameDAC Potentiometer Replacement

If the dial on your SteelSeries Arctis Pro Plus GameDAC isn't functioning, follow this guide to replace the potentiometer.

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INTRODUCTION

The GameDAC control wheel is the component that controls the dial of the GameDAC. This electrical component is called a potentiometer. When replacing the potentiometer, one should be careful of wired connections on the circuit board. Follow this guide to safely replace the potentiometer.



TOOLS:

- iFixit Opening Tools (1)
- iFixit Opening Picks set of 6 (1)
- Soldering Iron (1)
- Phillips #0 Screwdriver (1)

Step 1 — GameDAC Potentiometer







- Remove the plastic cover using the iFixit opening tool to pry the cover open.
- Insert opening picks to keep the cover open as you work your way around the GameDAC.
- Pop the cover off.

Step 2





Remove the control wheel from the GameDAC by pulling on the knob.

Step 3





- Remove the five 6mm screws using the Phillips #0 driver head.
- (i) There is one screw hidden on the upper right-hand side of the display.

Step 4






Hold the sides of the GameDAC and pull apart.

non't pull the two sides apart quickly or forcefully to avoid tearing the wire connection between the two boards.


Step 5



 Remove the three 4mm screws from the circuit board using the Phillips #0 driver head.

Step 6





- Desolder the seven potentiometer pins from the board to remove the button.
- For help desoldering connections, follow this useful guide on How To Solder and Desolder Connections.
- Use caution when soldering. The heated tip may cause damage to the board or burn you.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
