



# Jeans 2-Hole Button Replacement

How to sew a 2-Hole Button on a pair of jeans.

## INTRODUCTION

This is a simple repair of adding a two-hole button onto a pair of jeans. This repair requires a needle, thread, fabric scissors, and a fabric marker. After following the steps in this guide, a two-hole button should be firmly attached to a pair of jeans. Keep in mind that the needle being used is sharp and is hard to spot if dropped.

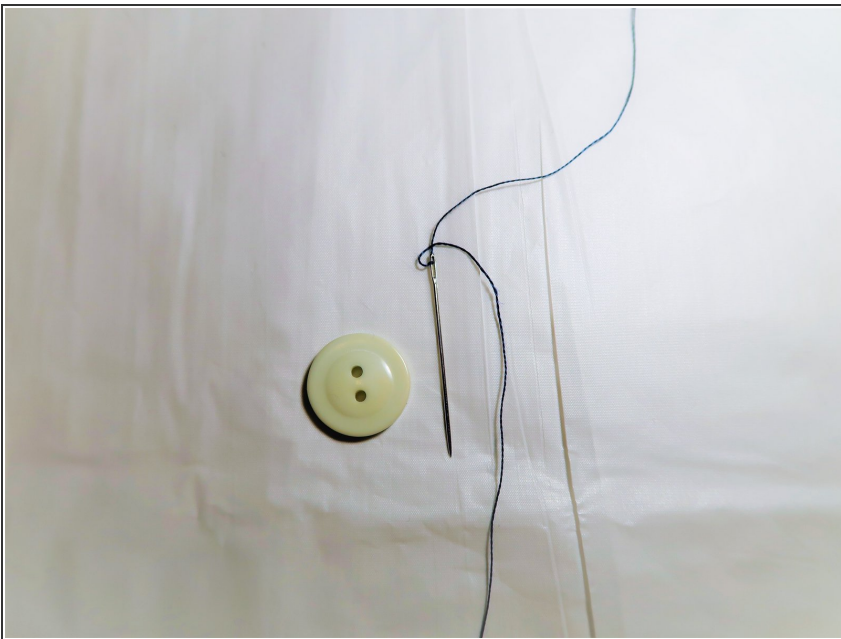


## Step 1 — 2-Hole Button



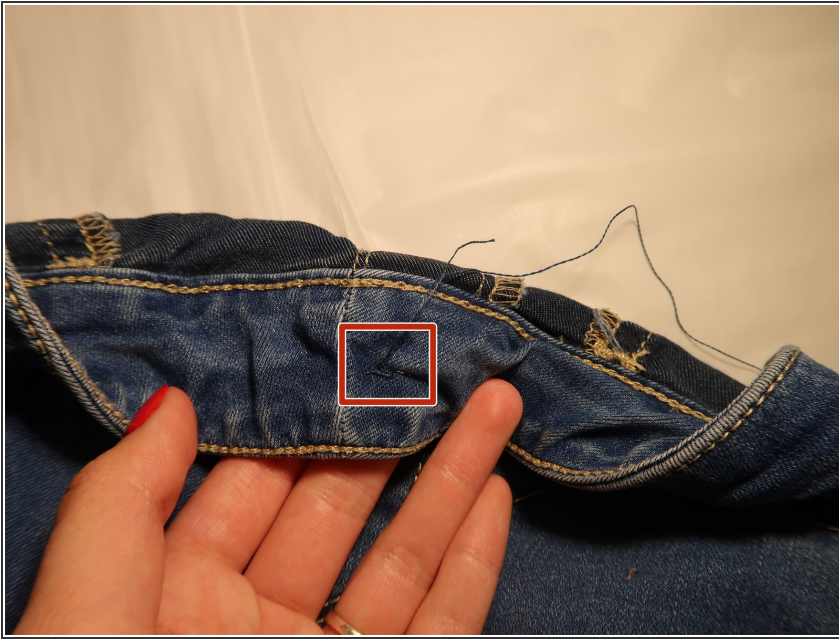
- Find a thread color that matches the fabric you are sewing the button on to.

## Step 2



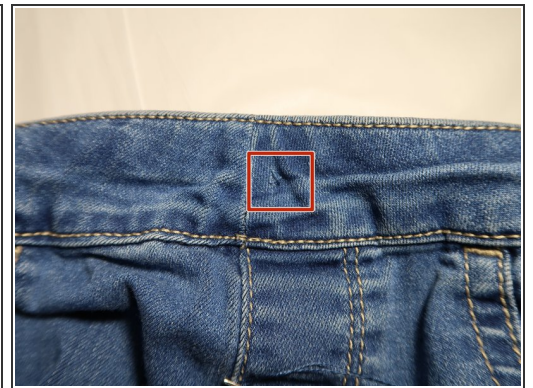
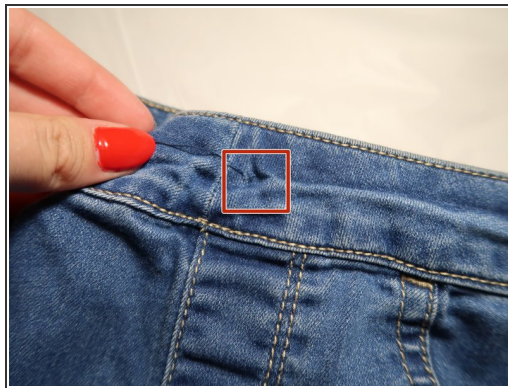
- Loop the thread through the eye of the needle.
- Tie a small knot around the eye of the needle with the thread.
- ⓘ Make sure the knot is tight!

### Step 3



- Thread the needle through the fabric from the inside out.
- Tie a knot at the end of the thread after pulling most of it through the fabric.

### Step 4



- Sew the thread in a small 'x' where you would like to place the button.

**i** If you don't want to sew, then mark the spot with a white fabric marker.



## Step 5



- Place the button over the small stitched 'x' or fabric marker spot.
  - Thread the needle through the left hole of the button from the inside out.
  - Pull the needle and thread all the way through the fabric.
- i** If you can't find the hole of the button, thread the needle through the fabric first and then through the button hole.

## Step 6



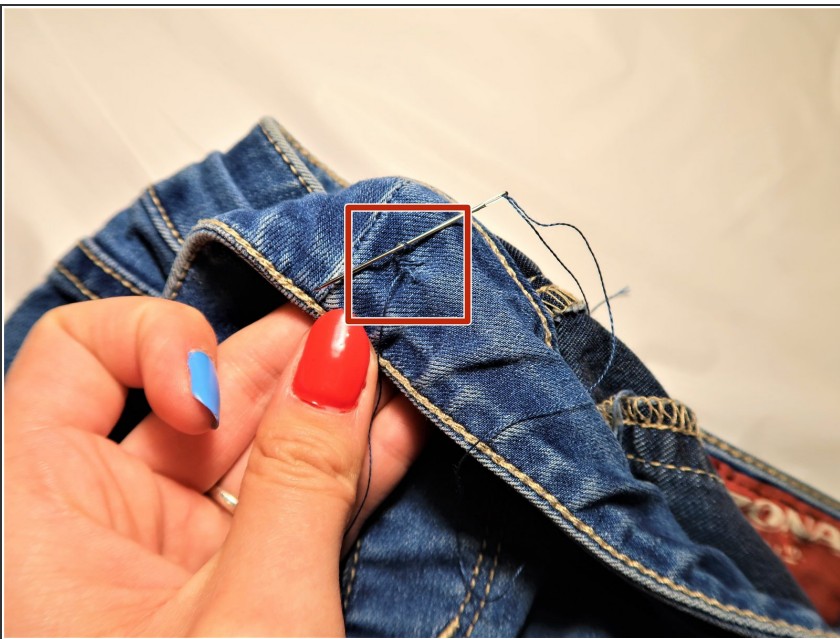
- Cross the needle over to the right hole of the button.
  - Thread the needle all the way through the fabric.
- i** This step creates the first stitch.

## Step 7



- Repeat Steps 6-7 four to five times, until you have a secure button.

## Step 8



- Create a thread shank on the inside of the fabric by looping the thread around a stitch.
- Pull the thread all the way through the hole until it is tight.
- ⓘ Repeat this 2-3 times.
- Tie a knot after the final stitch to secure the stitches.



## Step 9



- Use fabric scissors to cut off excess thread.

After cutting the remaining thread, your button stays on your jeans.
