

# Marco TA1 Gas Bottle Replacement

This tutorial guides you through the gas bottle replacement on a MARCO TA1 hand-held gas horn.

## **INTRODUCTION**

Spare bottles may be with different gases, according to your needs.

Flammable gas: LINK

# **PARTS:**

• TA1 Spare Bottle (1)

## Step 1 — Let's get ready



You need your TA1 handheld horn and a spare gas bottle to proceed.

### Step 2 — Remove the trumpet from the gas bottle







- Press down the flap.
- → Be careful: if you press too much it may break.

### Step 3 — Push the half-circle lock







While pressing the flap, move the half-circle lock to free the trumpet from the tank.

## Step 4 — Remove the trumpet from the bottle





(i) You don't need the empty tank anymore. Dispose it like required from your local laws.

# Step 5 — Take the new gas bottle



 Take the new bottle and remove the cap.

# Step 6 — Open the lock





Open the lock on the trumpet.

### Step 7 — Put the trumpet on the bottle





Put the trumpet on the bottle.

⚠ BE CAREFUL. Keep your fingers away from the trumpet and red circled moving parts: when the trumpet is on the gas bottle and you press it, it will honk!!


## Step 8 — Close the lock on the bottle





↑ BE CAREFUL. The horn may honk if you press it too strong on the red marked part.

### Step 9 — Check that the lock it's completely sealed





- (i) The red circled lock has to be like in the picture, out and up. If it's still inside, the trumpet may disconnect.
- (i) The blue circled part should be like in the picture, with no space between the components.

## Step 10 — You've finished!



Your gas horn it's now up and running, ready to be used again! There's no limit on the number of times you change the gas bottle.
