

# 1995-2001 Honda CRV Radio Replacement

This guide explains how to remove the radio in a 1995-2001 Honda CRV.

#### **INTRODUCTION**

If your radio has stopped working or you are looking to upgrade your factory radio, you can use this guide to remove the factory radio from your 1995-2001 Honda CRV. Follow these steps to remove the radio.




## **TOOLS:**

Phillips #0 Screwdriver (1)

#### Step 1 — 1995-2001 Honda CRV Radio Replacement







- Remove the clips in the glovebox by pushing them in.
- Using a Phillips #0 screwdriver, remove one screw on left side of the glovebox frame and one screw on the right side of the glove box.







- Use your hands to open the fold-down pocket.
- Use a Philips #0 screwdriver to remove the four screws surrounding the fold-down pocket.
- Use the Phillips #0 to remove the final screw from the fold-down pocket.





- Use a plastic panel tool to remove the plastic clip from the left side of the trim panel below the fold down pocket.
- Use the same panel tool to remove the plastic clip from the right side of the trim panel below the fold down pocket.

## Step 4






- Use a Phillips #0 screwdriver to remove the two screws from the driver-side dashboard.
- Use a plastic panel tool to unclip the edges of the dashboard.





- Use your hands to pull off the center dash.
- Remove the 13mm screws connecting the console to the frame.

## Step 6



- Use your hand to unplug the cigarette lighter and A/C Controls.
- Use caution to avoid damaging the wires.





- Use your hands to gently remove the radio bezel.
- Use your fingers to unclip the radio harness from the radio.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
